4. FIRST AID MEASURES

4.1 Description of First Aid Measures

General Advice: Get medical attention if symptoms occur.

If swallowed: Call a poison control center or doctor immediately for treatment advice. Have person sip a glass of water if able to swallow. Do not induce vomiting unless told to do so by a poison control center or doctor. Do not give anything by mouth to an unconscious person.

4.2 Most Important Symptoms and Effects, Acute and Delayed

Symptoms: Oral: Danger of serious damage to health by prolonged exposure through inhalation. Harmful if inhaled. Causes damage to organs through prolonged or repeated exposure. May cause an allergic skin reaction.

5. FIRE FIGHTING MEASURES

5.1 EXTINGUISHING MEDIA:

6.2 ENVIRONMENTAL PRECAUTIONS

Environmental Precautions: This pesticide is toxic to fish and aquatic invertebrates. Drift and runoff may be hazardous to aquatic organisms in water adjacent to treated areas. The active ingredient in this product can be persistent for several months or longer. Do not apply directly to water or to areas where surface water is present or to intertidal areas below the mean highwater mark, or other sensitive areas that may be exposed to spray drift. Do not contaminate water when disposing of equipment washwaters or rinsate.

6.3 METHODS AND MATERIALS FOR CONTAINMENT AND CLEAN-UP
