4. FIRST AID MEASURES

6. ACCIDENTAL RELEASE MEASURES

Clean up spills immediately observing the precautions in Section 8 of this MSDS. Isolate the hazard area and keep unnecessary and unprotected personnel from entering. In case of spill on floor or paved surfaces, mop up and remove to chemical waste storage area until proper disposal can be made if product cannot be used according to label. Prevent material from contaminating soil or from entering sewage and drainage systems and bodies of water. Dike and contain the spill with inert material such as sand, earth, etc. Transfer liquid to containers and solid diking material to separate containers for recovery and disposal.

7. HANDLING AND STORAGE

Avoid contact with skin, eyes, or clothing. Wash thoroughly with soap and water after handling and before eating, drinking, chewing gum, using tobacco, or using the toilet. Wear long sleeved shirt and long pants, shoes plus socks and chemical-resistant gloves (such as Natural Rubber, Selection Category A). Remove and wash contaminated clothing before reuse. Keep pesticide in original container. DO NOT put concentrate or dilute spray into food, feed, or drink containers. Do not store or use near oxidizing agents. Avoid contamination of feed and foodstuffs. Store in a cool, dry place, preferably in a locked storage area. DO NOT store diluted spray.
