- Eye** : Hold eyes open and rinse slowly and gently with water for 15 to 20 minutes. Remove contact lenses, if present, after first 5 minutes, then continue rinsing eye. Call a poison control center or doctor for further treatment advice.
- Skin** : Take off contaminated clothing. Rinse skin immediately with plenty of water for 15 to 20 minutes. Call a poison control center or doctor for treatment advice.
- Inhalation** : Move person to fresh air. If person is not breathing, call 911 or an ambulance, then give artificial respiration, preferably mouth-to-mouth, if possible. Call a poison control center or doctor for further treatment advice.
- Ingestion** : Call a poison control center or doctor immediately for treatment advice. Rinse mouth with water. Do not induce vomiting. Do not give anything by mouth if unconscious.

- Precautions for Safe Handling** : Keep locked up and out of reach of children. Keep packages tightly closed and do not allow water to be introduced to the container contents.
- Conditions for Safe Storage** : Store in a temperature range of 32 Degrees F. and 100 Degrees F. Store in original container only. Do not store near heat or open flame. Exposure to below freezing temperatures for an extended period of time may result in the formation of gel and/or crystals. If this occurs, expose the product to ambient temperatures greater than 55 Degrees F. This will result in reconstitution of the product, with no degradation of the active ingredient.
