#### SECTION 5: FIRE-FIGHTING MEASURES

ACUTE HEALTH HAZARDS: This product is slightly hazardous (WHO Hazard Class III)

CHRONIC HEALTH HAZARDS: Propiconazole technical has been extensively tested on laboratory mammals and in test-tube systems. Chronic administration of large doses of Propiconazole technical was associated with an increased liver tumor incidence in mice but not in rats. This proved to be related to a promotive effect of Propiconazole technical on proliferative changes genetically pre-existing in mice and therefore has no relevance to humans. No evidence of mutagenic, teratogenic or reproductive effects was obtained.

#### SECTION 12: ECOLOGICAL INFORMATION
