## 4. First-aid measures

**Inhalation** If breathing is difficult, remove to fresh air and keep at rest in a position comfortable for breathing. Call a physician if symptoms develop or persist.

## 5. Fire-fighting measures

## 6. Accidental release measures

<b>Methods and materials for containment and cleaning up</b>	Eliminate all ignition sources (no smoking, flares, sparks, or flames in immediate area). Keep combustibles (wood, paper, oil, etc.) away from spilled material.  Large Spills: Stop the flow of material, if this is without risk. Dike the spilled material, where this is possible. Use a non-combustible material like vermiculite, sand or earth to soak up the product and place into a container for later disposal. Prevent entry into waterways, sewer, basements or confined areas. Absorb with earth, sand or other non-combustible material and transfer to containers for later disposal. Following product recovery, flush area with water.  Small Spills: Clean surface thoroughly to remove residual contamination. For waste disposal, see section 13 of the SDS.  Never return spills to original containers for re-use.
<b>Environmental precautions</b>	Avoid discharge into drains, water courses or onto the ground.

## 7. Handling and storage
