SECTION 2: HAZARDS IDENTIFICATION

EMERGENCY OVERVIEW: Light gray to off-white liquid suspension. Slight chlorine odor. Causes substantial but temporary eye injury. May be fatal if inhaled. Harmful if absorbed through skin. Harmful if swallowed.
